

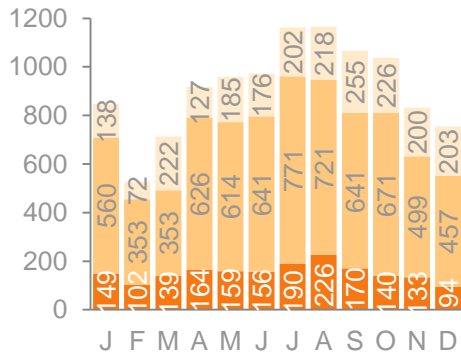
PENNSYLVANIA 2-1-1 EAST

2014 CALL VOLUME

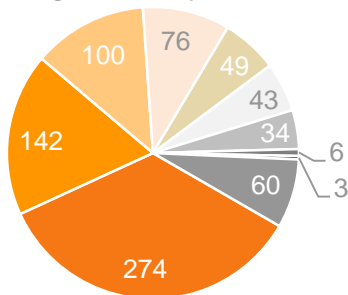
In December we experienced a total housing related call volume of **660**.

PRESENTING NEEDS

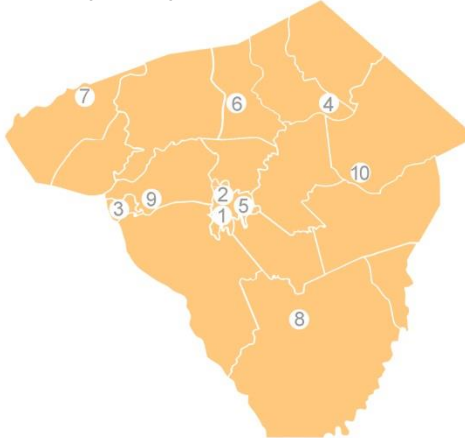
Some callers have multiple housing concerns. Captured are the total housing needs requested.

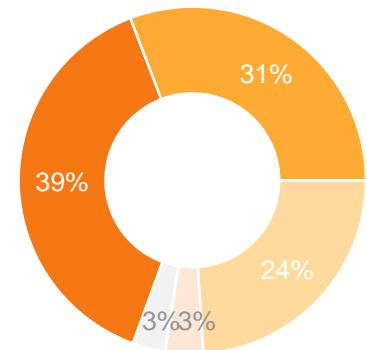
